COMMON GROUNDER DEFINITION

A Common Grounder seeks points of agreement on social and political issues through listening and productive conversation.

THE TEN ATTRIBUTES OF COMMON GROUNDERS

They:

- 1. Commit to seeking agreement, progress and solutions.
- 2. Listen first to understand other perspectives and experiences.
- 3. Seek to understand a person's motives or intentions rather than assume them.
- 4. Seek outcomes that will address the concerns of all parties, but without the need to compromise fundamental principles.
- 5. Use and accept facts and objective information even when it does not fit their own views.
- 6. Identify and set aside personal biases.
- 7. Acknowledge that good people can have different views about the same issue.
- 8. Maintain a respectful tone and manner; do not give in to anger or retaliation.
- 9. De-escalate hostile situations.
- 10. Resist demonizing.

Common Grounders set the example for productive discourse and behaviors and thereby create other common grounders.

Will Hurd

Former Congressman (R-TX)


Will Hurd is currently a managing director at Allen & Company and former member of Congress, cybersecurity executive, and undercover officer in the CIA. For almost two decades he's been involved in the most pressing national security issues challenging the country, whether it was in the back-alleys of dangerous places, boardrooms of top international businesses or halls of Congress.

After stopping terrorists, preventing Russian spies from stealing our secrets, and putting nuclear weapons proliferators out of business, Will helped build a cybersecurity company that prepared businesses for the next domain of conflict – cyberspace.

While in Congress, Texas Monthly and Politico Magazine called Will "The Future of the GOP," because he put good policy over good politics at a time when America was often consumed with what divides us rather than what unites us. He was able to get more legislation signed into law in three terms than most congressmen do in three decades – substantive legislation like a national strategy for Artificial Intelligence.

Will is a native of San Antonio and earned a Computer Science degree from Texas A&M University. Additionally, he is growing the US transatlantic partnership with Europe as a trustee of the German Marshall Fund, an OpenAl board member, and most recently served as a fellow at the University of Chicago Institute of Politics. He is also the author of American Reboot: An Idealist's Guide to Getting Big Things Done.





Chris Murphy

US Senator (D-CT)

Chris Murphy is a United States Senator from Connecticut. He serves on the Foreign Relations Committee, the Health, Education, Labor and Pensions Committee, and the Appropriations Committee. Prior to the Senate, Murphy served for three terms in the U.S. House representing the state's fifth congressional district. In Congress, Murphy is acknowledged as a leading voice for stronger anti-gun violence measures, a smarter foreign policy, and reform of our nation's mental health system.

Before being elected to Congress, Murphy served for eight years in the Connecticut state legislature. Murphy graduated with honors from Williams College in Massachusetts, and received his law degree from the University of Connecticut School of Law. He is married to Catherine Holahan, an attorney, and they have two sons, Owen and Rider.

ASSAULT-STYLE WEAPONS AND HIGH-CAPACITY MAGAZINES

83% of Democrats believe assault-style weapons should be banned and 83% believe high-capacity magazines should be banned (Pew Research/2021).

CONCEALED CARRY

20% of Democrats support allowing concealed carry in more places (Pew Research/2021).

72% of Republicans support allowing concealed carry in more places (Pew Research/2021).

GUNS IN SCHOOLS

90% of Democrats support preventing people with mental illnesses from buying guns (Pew Research/2021) and 80% support funding the study of the connection between mental health and gun violence (YouGov/2022).

Common Ground:

66% of Republicans support allowing teachers and officials in K-12 schools to carry guns (Pew Research/2021).

NRA (NATIONAL RIFLE ASSOCIATION)

24% of Democrats have a very or mostly favorable view of the NRA (Gallup/2018).

Common Ground:

88% of Republicans have a very or mostly favorable view of the NRA (Gallup/2018).

SECOND AMENDMENT RIGHTS

92% of Democrats view controlling gun violence as more important than protecting gun rights (Marist/2022).

Common Ground:

70% of Republicans view protecting gun rights as more important than controlling gun violence (Marist/2022).

RAISING MINIMUM AGE TO BUY GUNS

91% of Democrats support raising the minimum age to purchase any gun to 21 years old (Quinnipiac University/2022).

Common Ground:

59% of Republicans support raising the minimum age to purchase any gun to 21 years old (Quinnipiac University/2022).

BACKGROUND CHECKS

89% of Democrats in urban areas and 90% of Democrats in rural areas believe private gun sales and sales at gun shows should be subject to background checks (Pew Research/2021).

Common Ground:

77% of Republicans in urban areas and 62% of Republicans in rural areas believe private gun sales and sales at gun shows should be subject to background checks (Pew Research/2021).

MENTAL HEALTH

90% of Democrats support preventing people with mental illnesses from buying guns (Pew Research/2021) and 80% support funding the study of the connection between mental health and gun violence (YouGov/2022).

Common Ground:

85% of Republicans support preventing people with mental illnesses from buying guns (Pew Research/2021) and 68% support funding the study of the connection between mental health and gun violence (YouGov/2022).

RED FLAG LAWS

85% of Democrats support the creation of red flag laws that allow a court to temporarily remove guns from people that are believed to pose a danger to themself or others (YouGov/2022). Common Ground:

55% of Republicans support the creation of red flag laws that allow a court to temporarily remove guns from people that are believed to pose a danger to themself or others (YouGov/2022).

DEMOGRAPHICS

Democrats (18%), non-White Americans (18%), women (19%) and Eastern residents (21%) are the least likely to report personal gun ownership (Gallup/2020).

Common Ground:

Republicans (50%), rural residents (48%), men (45%), and Southerners (40%) are the most likely subgroups to say they personally own a gun (Gallup/2020).


