A MESSAGE FROM OUR FOUNDERS

Dear Friends,

The U.S. has become a landscape of ideological silos. We might live within the same borders, but the terrain of polarizing beliefs doesn't offer much of an ecosystem for cooperation. This divisive climate makes it difficult to speak to one another, much less accomplish anything on the policy level. As we head into a critical and volatile election year, prioritizing the need to make progress on our most important issues via productive conversations among citizens and leaders becomes more crucial than ever. Progress requires finding common ground, which only happens when we commit to listening to and understanding those who disagree with us.

Not only do we know it's possible, but we are seeing it happening and are grateful to have it supported by people like you.





Your commitment to moving beyond conflict to progress helps us to model and cultivate the conversations at all levels that ultimately make a difference. That commitment is yielding results.

We know people are listening. In the past year, we've seen tremendous growth in the number of people tuning in to our panels and podcasts tackling the tough issues—climate, race, media, and more. Our biweekly "Let's Find Common Ground" podcast discussions with citizens and thought leaders now reach over 270K subscribers. Downloaded episodes have more than doubled in the past year alone to more than 475k downloads. Our social media work directly connects us with 81,000 followers on Facebook, Instagram, X, LinkedIn, and YouTube. And our public forum event webcast, in partnership with New York's 92nd Street Y, reached 30,000 viewers at home, who, on average, watched the hour-long program for over 40 minutes.

Moreover, our public forum events that feature luminaries such as James Carville and Reince Priebus, Will Hurd, and Chris Murphy have found a new relationship with WETA, the PBS affiliate in Washington, DC, who have been running our forums in prime time. We are truly excited to share the news that our forums will soon be distributed through the National Education Telecommunications Association, making our programming available to **every public television station in the country**.

We are particularly pleased and grateful to report that your political leaders are listening, too. Our Common Ground Scorecard—the first tool to allow voters to compare how candidates and elected officials for Congress, Governorships, and the Presidency rank on bipartisanship—has gained incredible traction, with **politicians now approaching CGC** for advice on raising their score. Forty-two members of Congress and two Governors have affirmed they do and will abide by the Ten Attributes of a Common Grounder, our model for progress-focused discussion and debate.

As we close in on our next Presidential election, we can enable an elevated level of discourse bolstered by an electorate that values a healthier Democratic landscape. By supporting CGC, you are part of the active solution to revitalize the voters formerly known as the exhausted majority, showing that it is possible for them and our political leaders to come together in civility to solve tough problems.

Your support of CGC allows that to happen, to make a difference for our citizens, our leaders, and our country.

We believe that we change the country by changing the conversation from conflict to progress. And we encourage you to join us as our work continues to accelerate the momentum for progress that is quietly building across our nation.

HOW DIVIDED ARE AMERICANS?

On average, Democrats and Republicans are farther apart ideologically today than at any time in the past 50 years (Pew Research Center analysis of Voteview, March 2022). Pew Research also indicates that congressional Democrats and Republicans are further apart ideologically than at any point during the past five decades.

But these factors alone do not tell the whole story.

While deep divisions still exist, we are starting to see the tide turn. At this critical juncture it is imperative we do not let up.

Research also indicates that on a wide range of issues and policies, Americans from both parties can find agreement. Further, two-thirds of Americans say they are more likely to vote for a candidate willing to compromise with others in order to get results, over a candidate who constantly fights for the values without getting results (The Georgetown Institute of Politics and Public Service's Battleground Poll).

There is a deep yearning in the country to move beyond our current culture wars and address the deep issues we are facing. The media is also taking notice. New programming such as Common Ground segment with Brett Baier and Judy Woodruff Presents: America at a Crossroads.

Our proprietary research shows that our supporters want CGC to help in specific ways. A primary desire of our supporters and funders – people like you – is to restore hope in the country's future. To regain a sense of what is possible, and that progress can be made. You want a clear view of the issues and to understand a path forward that enables progress. Equally important, you want to hold leaders accountable for taking action and solving problems.

A unique digital tool for voters launched in 2020, the Common Ground Scorecard assesses the ability and propensity for a candidate to work across the aisle to find common ground that breaks gridlock.

Candidates are reacting to the Scorecard by affirming the commitment to be a Common Grounder. Local media's response has been enthusiastic with dozens of articles written to date.

CGC launched an improved version of the tool in July 2022 and a new page dedicated to the presidential election in spring 2023 in anticipation of increasing interest and response for this year's election season.




